For the past three years, the Hesston College men's soccer team has started their August pre-season by volunteering at camps during the day and playing soccer in the evening.

The team chose Camp Mennoscah this year. Coach Matt Gerlach states, "Volunteer work starts breaking down the walls of selfishness by



putting others ahead of yourself. It also builds trust and a bond among those serving together, which is an important part of our team's identity."

Luis, a freshman defender, had this to say about the experience: "I enjoyed the ability to meet my teammates on a deeper level before we went full throttle on the season. This week allowed us to gel as a group and really get to know each other." Jonathan, a sophomore team captain and defender, added, "I enjoyed being part of a group of young men who were working together to benefit others."

Gardell was complementary of the team's work: "It's always interesting to work with people you don't know, as work ethic and skills are unknown. I was impressed with their ambitions for future endeavors as I talked to each player. We did things that week some of them had never done before, and I was telling them, 'Do you know how long this would take me if I was doing it by myself?' The work they accomplished may not be a brand new building or playground, but I think it gave them a deeper understanding of what a good feeling it can be to contribute in a way many others can't. I hope it helped them from a teamwork standpoint as they played soccer this fall."

Coach Gerlach thought the facilities and Retreat Center worked great and "kick-started our team chemistry". He chose camp because of Hesston College connections, the facilities, and location to practice fields west of Wichita. The young men painted a lot



of Camp Mennoscah red, cleared brush and trees, and also cleaned out and organized a shed. The week was a win for the team and Camp Mennoscah!

As Eden Mennonite Church youth sponsors, Kathy & Lee would take the youth to Fall Holiday at camp and would help in the kitchen, Kathy usually helping with food preparation and Lee washing dishes. Both Kathy and Lee would also typically attend Eden's annual church retreat each July.

When it came time to designate a memorial for Kathy's funeral service, it was easy to choose Camp Mennoscah because of how important it was to her and Lee. She enjoyed camp and always wanted to help provide a space for kids to have the same experiences she had. 


