Power Line Going Up North of Camp

Renewable energy is moving close to Camp Mennoscah this spring. NextEra Energy is constructing a transmission line 340 feet from Camp Mennoscah's north property line. The power line will carry energy from a wind farm in Pratt County to a relay station near Colwich.

north of Camp. While not objecting to wind energy,

members of the Camp board and staff met with representatives of NextEra Energy several times to request that the transmission line be moved at least 500 feet north of the Camp property line. While the result is not what we requested, it is about two-thirds of our request (340 feet is 68 percent of 500 feet).

The poles will be 80-100 feet tall and will be visible from camp grounds. However, moving the poles farther north will reduce their visibility and any possible The initial proposal called for the poles to be just 75 feet humming noise that might be heard from Camp. Construction is expected to be completed by June.


