We're taking a risk looking at how to accommodate the Senior High Camp as the camp continues to grow and asking why our PreJunior camps have not grown.

Every summer parents take a risk sending their campers to Camp Mennoscah for a week of summer youth camp. The parents trust us to care for their campers physically and spiritually. They trust us to love and look after their campers in everything that we do.

The summer youth camp registration form has a permissions section which states "I acknowledge that camping entails known and unanticipated risks." There are the known risks. We go swimming, we play Borrow the Balls, we go fishing and trek through the river. We use wood burners in crafts. But campers and staff take risks in so many other ways that likely were not considered when the form was created.

We risk being laughed at or thought to be stupid. We risk our hearts when making new friends. We risk not being seen for who we are—or even being seen for who we actually are. Sharing jokes or the stories of our lives have an element of risk. Speaking up in a cabin group is a risk. Accepting others who are not like us is a risk.

Throwing yourself whole-heartedly into an activity that is not "cool" is risky. Testing your beliefs, struggling with your faith, and making commitments to God are all risky.

All of these intangible risks are scarier to me than many of the physical risks that we take.

There is a risk in doing new things.

There is a risk in staying the same.

We took a chance this past summer in working to be more inclusive with our activities so that we might better serve campers. We're making adjustments and looking at new ways to do things because someone took the risk to say, "Hey, there are some easy things that could be done to make Camp Mennoscah more inviting and more comfortable to some. Can we talk about it?"

This may not seem like much of a risk. But it required trust and long conversations. It required learning new things. We had to change how we viewed activities and how we responded to different situations. It took time and there is still more we can do.

It's a growing process and growth means risk and creativity. It also means listening to others, hearing from others and getting support from others. We want to hear your ideas. And we're all here to support each other as risk-takers and part of God's community in this sacred space called Camp Mennoscah.



The warm weather this fall has created a comfortable work environment for the Miller Construction crew working on the addition to the kitchen! They have sure been working quickly to have the new construction

> enclosed within the next month. It hasn't taken long to put up the exterior walls, frame the interior of the addition, and set the trusses.

One challenge was shingling the roof to create a seamless transition between the existing kitchen and the new construction. But, they were up to the task and have done excellent work! As I am

writing, the crew is making progress on the exterior walls, which will have the same stucco look as the existing facility. Once the doors and windows are

in place, construction will pause until the end of the 2017 camping season, when the major renovations to both kitchen and dining hall will resume.
